I invite you to explore the report, give yourselves a pat on the back, and reach out to your peers to give them a shoutout for their achievements. And there are many:


- The transition of Service Enterprise administration from Points of Light to AL!VE





Each year, AL!VE partners with Better Impact to host a hybrid conference that offers four 60-minute workshops centered on a particular theme trending in the volunteer sector. The conference is live-streamed internationally throughout the day and provides the opportunity to learn locally through host-site partners.






SERVICE ENTERPRISE

AL!VE is now the proud national administrator of the Service Enterprise program which brings together training partners and hubs across the nation to collaboratively lead the effort to help organizations effectively and efficiently leverage volunteers and their skills throughout the organization to deliver their mission. With our network of hubs ranging from California to Maine, Minnesota to Florida, and National Trainers, we can serve organizations across the United States through in-person or virtual organization change management training to engage volunteers more strategically in their mission delivery efforts.

Since October of 2022 we supported 24 training hubs through the transition, provided an AL!VE Academy about Service Enterprise to our members, began to recognize certifying organizations, alerted AL!VE members about upcoming opportunities to participate in their communities, and more. With Service Enterprise we will be an essential professional resource continuing to advocate for those who engage, motivate, and celebrate volunteers
